

SUSTAINABLE FARMING INCENTIVE IN 2022

SFI will pay farmers to do things that support food production and are good for the environment.

In 2022, there are two soils 'standards' and one moorland 'standard'. We'll be rolling out more standards in 2023-2025, so you'll be able to add more standards to your agreement and get paid for doing more. Information on the future SFI rollout will be on GOV.UK.

KEY FEATURES

- · If you and your land are eligible, you can get an agreement
- You can choose how much land to enter there's no minimum or maximum area
- Agreements will last for 3 years
- You'll be paid on a quarterly basis your first payment will be made 3 months after your agreement starts
- You can request changes to your agreement each year - add more standards, increase the levels for existing standards, or add more land

AM I ELIGIBLE?

You can apply for SFI if:

- you're eligible for the Basic Payment Scheme
- the land is wholly located in England and eligible for the standard you select

You'll also need to have management control of the land for the 3-year SFI agreement. This will usually be the person actively farming the land who is the owner occupier or tenant. For 'rolling' year-by-year tenancies, you can enter this land into SFI if you expect to have control for the full 3 years.

It's possible to include the same land in SFI and another scheme (such as Countryside Stewardship and Environmental Stewardship) if:

- · you and your land are eligible for each scheme
- the activities or outcomes you're being paid for under each scheme are compatible
- you're not being paid for a similar activity or outcome on the same area of land at the same time ("double funding")

HOW TO APPLY

- Apply online in the Rural Payments service, using your existing sign in details
- Applications will remain open, so you can apply throughout the year at a time that works best for you

WHAT CAN I APPLY FOR IN 2022?

Arable and horticultural soils standard

Introductory level -£22 per hectare

Intermediate level -£40 per hectare

- 1. Complete a soil assessment and produce a written soil management plan
- 2. Test soil organic matter
- 3. Add organic matter to all land in the standard at least once during the 3-year agreement
- 4. Green cover on at least 70% of land in the standard over winter (Introductory level)

Green cover on at least 50% of land in this level of the standard over winter and multi- species cover crops on an additional 20% of the land (Intermediate level)


Improved grassland soils standard

Introductory level -£28 per hectare

Intermediate level -£58 per hectare

- 1. Complete a soil assessment and produce a written soil management plan
- 2. Test soil organic matter
- 3. Minimise bare ground no more than 5% of the total area of land entered into the standard left bare over winter
- 4. n/a (Introductory level)

Establish or maintain herbal levs on at least 15% of land in this level of the standard (Intermediate level)



Introductory level: £265 fixed per agreement per year plus £10.30 per hectare

- 1. Identify and record the soil and vegetation types and condition, and presence of historic and archaeological features
- 2. Assess the public goods the moorland is already providing
- 3. Identify opportunities to maintain or enhance the public goods provided by the moorland

Annual health and welfare review vet visits

SFI will also provide help for livestock keepers with the costs of veterinary advice to improve animal health and welfare. Further details coming later in 2022.
